## **VIPERS** information

#### Maths

- Place value and rounding of large numbers
- Interpreting Negative Numbers
- Place value of numbers up to three decimal places.
- Multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1000.
- Properties of numbers—multiples, factors, common factors, prime and composite numbers.

## English:

In English we will be using a number of beautiful books to inspire our writing, focusing in particular on grammar and spellings. Some of our core texts are:

- Monsterology—non-chronological texts with paragraphs
- Cloud Tea Monkeys descriptive writing

## Our whole class text will be: The Boy at the back of the class

#### Spellings:

- Review soft 'c' words in Year 5 Statutory spellings list
- Explore words with 'ei' after 'c'
- Review words with endings that sound like el
- Explore words with -cial or -tial
- Explore words ending in -cially or -tially
- Review words from Yr 3/4 Statutory spellings list
- Explore words ending with –able and -ible

# Reading:

Children are expected to read a minimum of five times a week at home. Reading regularly can greatly improve spelling and grammar and it gives children the opportunity to experience whole other worlds. There are a number of fantastic age related books that we can recommend, so please ask if you need any help choosing books for your child at home.

## Science: Properties and changes of materials

- Compare and group together materials based on their properties.
- Use knowledge of solids, liquids and gases to describe how mixtures might be separated, including through filtering, sieving and evaporating.

#### Geography: North America

- Locate the world's countries, using maps, concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, countries and major cities.
- Know the significance of the position of latitude, longitude, Equator, Northern Hemisphere, Southern Hemisphere, tropic if Capricorn, the Prime/Greenwich Meridian and time zones.

## PE: Swimming and Games Invasion

- · Develop understanding of water safety.
- · How to apply skills in a game.

## French: Sports and Olympics

- To name and spell at least three of the current events in the Olympics.
- To recognise and start to conjugate at least the JE and IL/ELLE form of the verb FAIRE accurately.

### **Music: Sea Shanties**

- · Listening and appraising
- Singing/Performing
- Improvisation

## Computing: We are Game Developers

In this unit, pupils plan their own simple computer game. They design characters and backgrounds, and create a working prototype, which they develop further based on feedback they receive.

## **PSHE:** Being me in my world

- Know how to face new challenges positively.
- Understand how to set personal goals.
- Understand the rights and responsibilities associated with being a citizen in the wider community and their country.
- Know how an individual's behaviour can affect a group and the consequences of this.

## **Art:** Self Portraits

- Know how to make choices about colour when painting.
- Know how to create detail with different brushes and different techniques that can be used e.g. layering of paint.
- Know about proportions in drawing a person. To understand and explain the primary and secondary colours.
- Focus artists—David Hockney and Frida Kahlo
